Steam Train races through Wingello

Wingello gathered to watch restored railway history in action



At 8:30am on Saturday 28 Feb, over 150 locals gathered at the train station to watch as a part of Australian railway history made a lightning visit.

There was a small brochure placed on the shop bench on Thursday Afternoon and we promoted it on Thursday night on our Facebook page. Word of mouth quickly spread and on Saturday morning people began gathering at the station and crossing waiting in anticipation.

Why so much interest in an old train? We believe that it is because we all like a bit of style and steam trains have that certain something. Also, as Wingello has always had a keen interest in the railway, and the sound

We saw the huge black engine with its gold 6029 emblazoned on the front rushing towards us, steam billowing in triumph and horn blaring in joy. There was no pause in its progress as it rushed at a frantic pace straight through the intersection and station and in seconds it was gone on to its destination Northwards. Dazed but smiling, with the sight and sound of a real steam engine in our memories, we all checked to see if we were able to capture any good photos in the window of opportunity we had.

And the best thing about the morning? The multitude of greetings and catching up with each other, the camaraderie and good will as villagers compared notes and generally had a great village experience. Many stopped off for coffee, cake and something to eat and linger a bit longer to retain more of the good time that was the visit of train 6029 to Wingello.




