The main road into and out of Wingello and the Entrance to the Southern Highlands is Murrimba Road. The recent rains, cold weather and busier traffic has meant small defects in the road have grown into pot holes and some massive rents in the road.

The road out of Wingello has 7 pot holes of reasonable size and the way in has over 12 pot holes including the massive pot chasm pictured below. This hole deserves special mention as it is right in a cutting of the road which means if there is oncoming traffic drivers have few options of avoidance.

To no surprise of the locals, the majority of the incoming pot holes are all part of the general degradation of Murrimba Road on the roadside widening performed a few years ago. Whilst the widening and road marking has been widely praised, the quality of the roadwork has been criticised since the beginning.



We have always enjoyed the beauty of Wingello and it's close integration with the bountiful Australian flora and fauna - that is one of the great features of living here. A key part of our enjoyment is getting here safely and without undue damage to our vehicles or ourselves.

There has been some discussion that perhaps the degeneration of the roads is some sort of planned obsolesence. Is this part of a secret Wingecarribee Shire Council Native Reclamation Project? "Revitalising the Shire" could be a typical slogan.


The team are looking forward to an interesting year getting to know what the community wants. First up is the Meet and Greet on Tuesday 4th at 2pm, with everyone welcome.

- A house fire in Forest Rd. Wingello RFB was assisted by Penrose and Bundanoon Rural brigades and Bundanoon Fire and Rescue. There was limited damage to the building thanks to the quick initial response of the Wingello brigade.
- A chimney fire in Camden St with no major damage.
- Motor Vehicle Accident (MVA) involving a car trailer that had become uncoupled on the Hume Highway.
- **Power lines down** at the corner of Forest Rd and Railway Pde. The brigade remained in attendance till the arrival of Integral Energy.
- A collision between a motor bike and a kangaroo on Murrimba Rd. The rider had significant injuries that resulted in an air lift by chopper from the Bill O'Reilly Oval.

Shake down exercises are continuing with the brigade's new unit Wingello 1. This truck has now had all of it's gear installed and crew familiarisation continues. Wingello 7 has also undergone some significant refurbishment
