We had a very good response from the council after the publication of August's Wingello Village News. Within a week there were warning signs up before the worst part of Murrimba road and shortly thereafter most of the pot holes had been patched with

bitumen - except for the worst one which was piled high with dirt.

Then we had the rain.

Now the dirt has mostly washed away leaving the worst part of the road as bad as ever, and about half a dozen new potholes started with other parts of Murrimba road having their edges falling away.

Murrimba Road is the entrance to the Southern Highlands and Wingello is the first stop for anyone entering the Southern Highlands from the South. So long as visitors look up and ignore the rumbling underneath their vehicles, everything is fantastic - lovely trees and wild-life all round, friendly and welcoming locals, a marvel-lous forest for riding or running, great coffee and more. Just be careful where you drive and walk.

The council has commissioned a survey asking locals what priorities their rates should be allocated to. For us, the priority in Wingello is the quality of the roads. If you get the call from the survey company, let them know what you think. For some reason, the survey only wants to hear from people 49 years old or younger.

Wingello Fire Brigade News

Wingello like many other places has experienced an incredible amount of rain over the past couple of weeks. The brigade was able to undertake a small hazard reduction burn on private property during this time.

The past month has seen the brigade called out to numerous incidents which have all been motor vehicle accidents. A good job done by all the crew members as most of these call outs were in wet and cold conditions at night.

The brigade will be participating in the State-wide RFS Open Day/Get Ready Weekend on the 12/13th September. All members of the Community are invited to drop in to the station between 9.30am and 2.30pm. Attractions include a giant slide for the kids and a colouring in competition for the local primary school children. The colouring in sheets will be handed out at the school according to their age group. The posters must then be handed in at the Station before 12 midday on the 12th September. The completed poster will be displayed in the Station and judging will take place at 1pm. Prizes will be given out for the winners in each of the four groups. Good luck to all entries.

During the course of the day we will demonstrate some fire fighting training procedures that we do. These will be carried out under the control of our deputies and training officers. The new Wingello I will be on display for all to see and feel free to inspect the station facilities and equipment.

There will be on display information sheets and brochures with some prices regarding firefighting equipment that are available within the area that may help you prepare your property more efficiently. Our brigade members will be on hand to advise and help whenever needed. We will also have on hand a display on how to protect your property and yourself and "Get Ready" for the oncoming fire season. Information sheets on the correct way to handle pile burns when allowable. We hope that you will have a look at what we have available and that it may help you in some way to protect your home.

The Brigade will also have its usual BBQ running, along with Coffee and tea also available for those who wish to indulge.

We have posted notices around the village about the old Siren that was used to summon the crew to a fire call. It has not been in use for some years since the advent of pagers and mobile phone messages but it was refurbished and is mounted on the Station. We will be sounding the siren at the start of the day's program at 9.30 on the 12th and then at the close of the day at 2.30pm it will only be for a brief moment each time but the long time residents of Wingello will remember it.

Don't forget that the fire season starts on the 1st of October and it will be No Fires without permits after that date.

The Brigade recently assisted with the Southern Highlands Challenge Marathon event in the Wingello State Forest by providing parking and marshalling services. This event attracted very large participation and is likely to get even bigger in years to come.
