

Wingello Fire Brigade News

Once again a busy month for the brigade but there were no incident calls during this period. The Open Day was held on 12 September with over sixty visitors to the station. The exhibitions we had, along with the information sheets on where and what would be useful for the protection of properties, equipment and materials they could use was greatly appreciated.

The Giant Slide for the children and some adults was a great success - we may have to use it again next year. The children had a lot of fun with it. Many thanks to the girls from the Brigade and Clare and Rose for watching over the young ones using the slide. Our BBQ was well attended all through the day and congratulations to the cook for a job well done.

The demonstrations that the brigade put on were also appreciated and showed the training procedures that the brigade members go through to give them the skills to fight various types of fires. The demonstration in regards to fat fires in the kitchen and the way they should be handled was well done. The spectators were not only shown the correct way to handle these fires but also what not to do - trying to put out a fat fire with water.

We also had a demonstration on pile burning. All Wingello residents should be well informed of the rules for pile burning. This is a big issue during the non fire season months and the 'No Fires Without A Permit' time. We should all be aware of the correct and proper procedure.

The Community Bush Fire Awareness meeting held in the park on the Sunday was poorly attended with just seventeen non brigade people attending. Those that did attend left with

a lot more knowledge about the Village History of fires and what they should do when the next time we are impacted by a fire. Once again we had refreshments along with our sausage sangers plus the attending people took with them information on what was available for them in the event of another fire. Many thanks to our President David Stimson for once again providing a top presentation.

We must thank all the Brigade members that gave up their time to help out with the set up and the running of the events on both days and are sure the people that attended appreciated their efforts.

The Brigade also assisted in a Hazard Reduction at Penrose along with Bundanoon, Marulan and Bungonia brigades - a good burn and not too long a day. Wingello along with other Brigades had a combined Southern Group training day this month. This enables the crews to get to know one another as well as to work together under difficult situations.

Now we are into the Fire Season please make sure that you all take note of the Fire Danger Rating sign changes opposite the Brigade Station. To ascertain where any fires may be, make sure you download the very helpful Smartphone app '**Fires Near Me**'.
