Matching people and their things is just part of the personal nature of Village life

The last few weeks have highlighted the great nature of Village life. Often people pop in to the shop and tell us they have found or lost their dog, cat, wallet, goat or almost anything. Not long later we get a phone call, email, Facebook message or visit asking if we have heard of the missing treasure.

Just this week we saw that one of the locals had found a cute little dog wandering about and cared for it. We saw the photo in the Wingello Facebook community page and shared it with everyone working at the shop. Next day another local popped in very concerned as the dog they were minding had gone missing. "This one?" we asked, showing the photo.

Another case solved by the community.

As long as the shop has been the central business in the village with it's Post Office and groceries and now also the cafe and restaurant, over 100 years of interactions and conversations have helped create a close network of information. We have clearly trained all who work at the shop that we are a centre of community information - not gossip. This has allowed us to match the message that someone has found this dog with another request that someone is missing the same dog.

Over the years we have matched up missing dogs, wallets, poorly addressed letters and parcels - and even goats - with the proper owners. So if you are trying to find something lost in Wingello, or have

found something that someone is probably missing, let us know. Or just drop in and say G'day.

It's that time of year as everyone is getting ready for the joyous time of Christmas and New Year and for most of us it's also a break from our regular work and school schedules. For many villagers this year online shopping is providing a very convenient means of getting the right presents delivered to your door (courier) or the Wingello Post Office. Typically we see parcel volumes double in the weeks leading up to Christmas.

If you have a courier delivering your parcel we cannot take delivery unless you have made prior arrangements. All Australia Post parcels are tracked so we have records of when they are delivered and picked up, but we are not part of the courier system and cannot take responsibility for their inability to look for

your house.

If you know a parcel has arrived, please arrange to have it picked up from the store as we have limited storage capacity and we would rather you have the treats than have them sitting here waiting for you.

Wingello Fire Brigade News

Well the fire season is well and truly upon us and has had an early start for the season. At present there are approximately 41 fires active around the state and mostly on the eastern coast area. They stretch from the Gold Coast area in the north to Wallaga lake in the south then out west as far as Coleambally in the Murrumbidgee area. So far all but three are under control.

Just recently I have had the opportunity to see some of the area out west and the grass lands there are thick with high and dry vegetation. Along with the recent spate of temperatures ranging into the mid to high thirties and hot dry westerly winds we have been lucky no to have had more severe grass fires in the western part of the state. Let's hope it stays that way.

The Brigade assisted in the recent Shoalhaven fires with two strike teams being deployed to help out. A good response and well done to both crews. Call outs were limited this month

with only one serious MVA on Murrimba Rd. where the injured were taken to hospital with some non life threatening injuries. According to the reports they were lucky. Murrimba Rd as we know is notorious for MVA's and mostly caused by avoiding wild life. It pays to be vigilant at all times especially at dusk and dawn.

The Brigade assisted Wild Horizons with the marshalling and communications of the Highland Fling. We would like to give a big thanks to all who assisted in the event not only our

crew members but the support people we had from the village as without their support from we would be hard pressed to fill the

positions that were needed many thanks once again to all.

The Brigade will once again be assisting Santa in visiting the Village on Christmas Eve and along with a couple of Elves will be handing out lolly bags to the children. Times of the event will be posted as soon as we confirm with Santa re his availability. A notice will be posted in the shop notice board well be for the date. I believe he will also be visiting Wingello Primary school on the 15th of December so keep a watch out for times.

1st of December, 2016

As from today all fire permits are suspended and no new permits will be issued at least till the end of the Statutory Fire period (31 March, 2017).

This decision has been taken by the RFS based on prevailing conditions and expected weather conditions over the summer period.
