


Thousands on the roads at Easter

An estimated 5,000 people came to see around 90 actors and support crew put on a play of the events for which Good Friday commemorates. The quality of the play is very high and as some locals mentioned to us, it was like seeing Mel Gibson's film but being right amongst the action. The play has been run for over 25 years and is getting better each year.



The play starts near the entrance and everyone walks to

each scene until the final crucifixion scene about 1200 metres from the beginning. It is quite an impressive event only 15 minutes away from Wingello.

The Fire Brigade was responsible for the parking for which they received good donations. The trickiest part was to quickly move everyone off the road and on to the grounds so the traffic did not back up and impact the Good Friday traffic escaping Sydney. They did a marvellous job, offering up their holiday time to raise the much needed funds for the brigade.

The **MAXXIS Wingello Forest Endurance Ride 2017** offers a range of opportunities, with 5km, 10km, and 20km rides on Saturday 27th May starting from 12n0on, and 20km, 41/61km and 80km rides on Sunday 28th May starting from 7am.
