



A 24 Hour Sand Mine next to a Shrine

What could be a problem with that?

An independent planning panel is set to review a NSW Southern Highlands application that could produce 29 million tonnes of concrete, tiling and mortar sand for the Sydney market.

The Sutton Forest Quarry Project application will go before the State's Independent Planning Commission (IPC), after 428 objections were submitted by deadline Thursday, 21 June, a spokesman for the planning department said.

Sutton Forest Quarries is seeking to open a sandstone quarry and processing plant, just off the Hume Highway. The extraction, processing and stockpiling areas will be on a site spanning 67 hectares.

The quarry is expected to have an output of one million tonnes per annum (tpa) of friable sandstone reserve that will yield approximately 860,000 tpa of sand products for sale [annually] over 45 years. A total of 21 million tonnes of light quality sand products will be produced in the first 30 years, and eight million tonnes in the following 15 years.

This proposed Sand Mine will be next to the Shrine of Divine Mercy on Hanging Rock Road, just near the Shrine's natural Grotto. The Shrine is visited by over 100,000 visitors every year and is important to many locals in the Wingecarribee Shire.

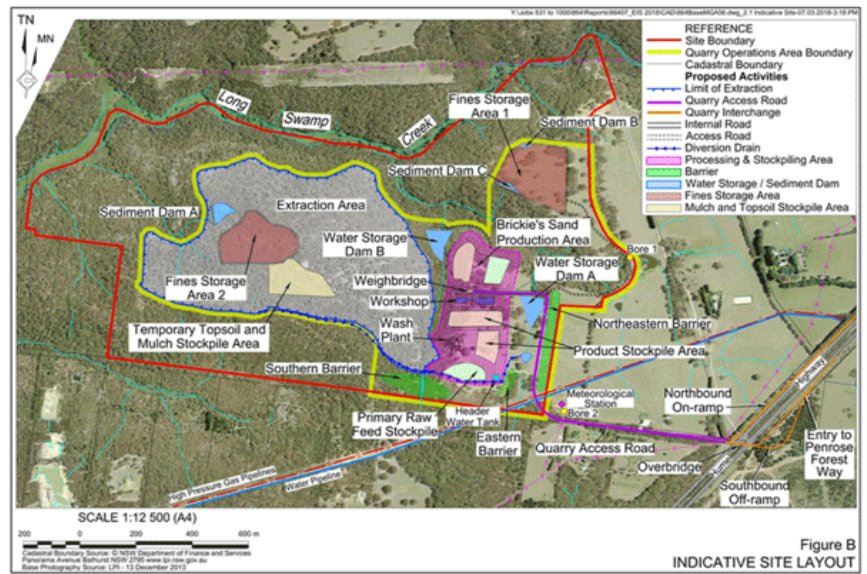
This is to be a long term mine with long term impacts on the local environment with continual open cut mining and truck movements 24 hours a day. As usual there is the claim that this will bring

Submissions by the company to Wingecarribee Council will be made on Wednesday, 11 July before the council meeting.
