

Fire Season Starts 1 September

The very dry Winter has meant an early start to the Bushfire Danger Period



The official Bushfire Danger period has been brought forward this year to **I September**. This means you MUST have a permit in order to light a fire from the 1st of September. As always check the Fire Danger Rating before lighting up.

The huge number of fires throughout NSW a few weeks ago were a graphic reminder of how dry everything is after a low rainfall Winter. As you can see in our rainfall chart covering the last eight years, we normally get

plenty of rainfall between June and August. However, this year's cumulative rainfall is only 373mm. The driest period in our chart to end of August was 2017 and that was 520mm. Locals are conserving water even more than normal.

So, how can you get ready for the this year's Bushfire Danger Period?

Get Ready Weekend on Saturday 22 September

The best way to learn how to live in a bushfire prone area is to know your local Rural Fire Brigade, especially one as well trained as we have in Wingello. The Get Ready Weekend has lots of very useful information available for you and even better you can get to know your local Firies who live in, and know, Wingello well.

The key is to understand how bushfires work in Wingello and thereby have a healthy respect for fire and not just an uneducated fear. Being prepared with knowledge and followed up with plans and appropriate training, practice and gear means we can all get the most out of living in a bush village.

Fire Awareness Meeting on Sunday 30 September at 2pm.

Just after a lovely lunch at the store you can wander over to the Wingello Village Hall and get a great understanding of the history of fire in Wingello, what is in place to defend the village, how the Wingello Fire Brigade works, what YOU should do before a fire has even happened and also when you know we have a fire nearby. These Awareness Meetings are excellent sources of information. If you live in Wingello, this is a **VERY NECESSARY** meeting to attend. It is too late to wonder what to do when you smell smoke in the air.

For example, if we are threatened by fires, you will be able to get up to date accurate information from the TV screen in the store. We will be open serving the community and staying put and defending ourselves in case of a bushfire. In the recent bushfire that threatened Wingello, a number of outlying residents worked out that escaping by road would be too difficult due to congestion and road closures, so they gathered their "bug out" bags and came to the store until the danger had passed. You need to consider that a fire with a

good wind will take less than 10 minutes to travel from the highway to Wingello!

In future, this will be even more useful with the Wingello Rural Fire Brigade's Community Notice-board providing the latest news about the fires relevant to us.

We have been very glad to work with the fire brigade to get this initiative going.

We also had from Wingello Brigade one of our deputies, Anthony Duffy, along with another 150 fire fighters and specialists deployed to California to assist with the horrendous fires over there - they are on a six deployment. Stay safe all.

Wingello has been blessed so far as far as fires go BUT do not get complacent: the worst is to come according to the Weather Bureau as this is the driest winter we have had for decades. So please be aware that this fire season could turn nasty so be vigilant and take note of the Fire Danger Ratings and weather conditions. Keep your property well prepared and have your Bush fire survival plan updated and ready.

The Brigade this month so far has had seven call outs. Some fire calls and some MVA's that have kept the crews busy at all times. We have now our first female driver in our Brigade. Congrats Lucy Brearley on obtaining your MR licence well done. Other members are undergoing their VF (Village Fire fighter) course

and others their crew leaders course. Keep up the good work people.

A big reminder that our **Get Ready Weekend** will be held at the station on **Saturday 22 September** and once again we will have the giant slide for the children, sausage sizzle, displays, demonstrations, fun stuff and information on how to be prepared, The sausage sizzle this year will be a gold coin donation to assist the Farmers fund.
