In all parts of Australia, especially in country and regional areas, it is an important custom to say "G'day".

This is an abbreviation of "Good Day" which is Australian shorthand for "Hello" and acknowledging that we're all part of this great country together.

Whether driving, walking or riding, a raised hand or sometimes just a finger or two - or if your hands are busy on the bike's handle bars, a nod works just as well - it is a simple yet important way to connect with the community.

A community is made up of individuals within families within homes and villages, towns and suburbs. A quick acknowledgement of another through the implied "G'Day" of a short wave, wrist or head nod is a great way of connecting to each other.

Try an experiment in human relations. Nod, say "G'day" and smile at others when you are going for a walk or drive or visiting the shops. Then have a second person following behind and see that contact being relayed on to the next person. We did this experiment in Sydney where I was walking ahead and one of my children was walking a short distance behind to observe the impact. A simple look at another person with an accompanying nod and smile resulted in a returning smile which was then relayed to the person behind me.

When you visit our store in Wingello you will get a friendly "G'day". It was amusing to have one visitor stop at the door after we greeted him and exclaim, "Well, we're not in Sydney today!"

It is great that so many villagers are enjoying a lovely walk through the village and seeing so many gardens growing so well after all the sun and rain. We are made part of the village life when we say "G'day" to fellow villagers who are also walking, or working in their gardens, or just resting on the verandahs, saying "G'day to all those that walk past. Everyone wins with "G'day"
