Lots of incremental improvements over 12 years

In February we will have been running the Wingello Village Store for 12 years. To put this in some context, Rose was 4 years old when we started. Here she is now doing a history lesson learning about telephone books:



During these last 12 years we have done a lot of experimenting to make the store serve the needs of Wingello villagers as well as many tourists, truckies and tradies and continue trying different things.

When we began in 2009 we used to sort two trays of letters and some parcels every day. Now we only get about half a tray of letters and 50 to 80 parcels per day.

We have served:

Almost 150,000 meals

Over 34,000 patties

Over 4 tonnes of bacon

Over 78,000 Buns and sandwiches

Over 153,000 Coffee, Tea and Milk-shakes

Phew! Not bad for the "Secret" entrance to the Southern Highlands.

Many of our villagers are working hard, waking up early to get to work. We are now opening the store from 6:30am for food and coffee as well as mail and parcels.

We will be trialling this for the next few months to determine the actual need.

Price Changes:

Our last price change was almost two years ago. Since that time there have been two pay increases and many product and other cost increases. We have done a comparison of our food prices with chain style burger and fast food outlets and compared our food on a per 100g basis. We are less expensive for everything. And, as one customer explained to his friend, "Yes, one of these burgers costs more, but you won't leave hungry!"

Wingello Fire Relief Fund

Just after the fires hit Wingello on 4 January 2020, we set up a special Wingello Fire Relief Fund. We correctly foresaw that all those millions of dollars donated by so many generous Australians would not make it down to Wingello. Many of our local villagers have been hit hard by the fires. Funding from the Wingello Fire Relief Fund, administered by the Wingello Village Association, have been able to harness local resources and clear a great many dead and dangerous trees and allow locals to move forward in their recovery.

Just this last month of January we have had 5 applications for relief to help cover the shortfall from insurance. Typically insurance will cover 12 months rent after a house is destroyed and clearing of

damage within a short perimeter around the house. The council will - maybe - clear dead trees that are only on the roadside verge with continual nagging, but if the tree is 1mm on the private boundary they won't assist.

It seems like things have been rather quiet for Wingello Rural Fire Brigade. There's hasn't been much to report in terms of response. This doesn't mean that our members have been doing nothing. James and Stephanie will be advancing their abilities with a new skillset - They are off to secure the 'Village Firefighter' (VF) qualification. This will help them to understand how to act/react in urban situations. This is also a prerequisite qualification for further training.

Kevin & Charles are on track to complete the 'BA Operators' course. This will give us more members capable of offensive firefighting, inside structures

wearing 'Breathing Apparatus' This is similar equipment to what a SCUBA diver might wear. They'll receive life giving air whilst working.

Thankfully, the COVID restrictions are lifting for training. This means that we will be getting together more regularly. This also means that if you are interested in coming around to see what we do on a Wednesday night, you are more than welcome.

Unfortunately the recent heat wave has forced us to suspend Pile Burn Permits. If you have a permit, it is a requirement that you call the Fire Control Centre to ensure that it is active.
