What is the benefit of a community organisation for Wingello?

The Wingello Village Association (WVA) was established a number of years ago to provide a communal method of interaction with the Council.

Being a local government bureaucracy, the Wingecarribee Shire Council is not good at dealing with issues presented by individuals. It is easier for them to adopt the normal ARID response method of dealing with annoying requests from the individual Shire Residents:

Avoid - Refuse - Ignore - Defer

However, when we present our concerns from a representative body such as the WVA we have been able to get a better response.

It still takes persistence and diplomacy and determination to push through to a satisfactory conclusion as it seems the main aim of local councils is to avoid working for the residents.

Over the years, the WVA has been involved in representing Wingello on behalf of village amenities and safety issues. Since the fires they have been quite busy interacting with the council regarding the cleanup and support and especially the maintenance of the council

unmaintained roadways such as Murrimba Road and Railway Parade.

The WVA works best in conjunction with other community groups such as the Wingello Rural Fire Brigade, The Wingello Village Store, the Hall Committee and other groups effectively getting a larger representative pool to lobby the council to do their job.

Over the last 12 months the WVA has assisted with the Wingello Bush Fire Relief Fund, providing over \$24,000 in assistance in the form of grants of between \$1,000 and \$2,000 for those affected by the fires. This direct funding has assisted in the clearance of almost as many dead, burnt trees as the Council cleared with their much higher budget.

The Fire Relief fund is a good example of locals helping locals as there was no administrative overheads or funds going to non locals.

So who runs the Wingello Village Association?

There is a President, Secretary, Treasurer and committee members.

Look in the mirror to see if you want to help.

This is a volunteer association of Wingello Residents (Full or Part time).

There is a membership fee of \$5 a year for those wishing to support the activities of the WVA and pays for public liability insurance to cover any WVA sponsored events, plus some minor stationery and other costs. Members can vote at the AGM for committee members.

That's pretty cheap for an organisation that can make a difference to all of us in Wingello.
