Small Businesses are the backbone of Australia, employing much more people than the mega corporations

In these times of government mandated restrictions, it is very important to remember the small and medium businesses that are heavily impacted. The Southern Highlands is very dependent on tourist traffic from Sydney, Canberra and surrounding areas, with many of the Shire business's employees, tradies and services coming from outside the Wingecarribee Shire.

While the large corporate enterprises are enjoying record profits, the smaller businesses have less reserves and typically lower profits. Yet small and medium businesses still provide the majority of employment within Australia, especially in regional and rural areas.

Our small business employs ten people. As you drive along the roads in the Shire and pass all the various little businesses, consider that they all employ typically between 2 and 10 people, with the mid sized businesses from 50 to 100 people.

Whilst the large corporates may employ local people for lower management and base positions, the local small and medium business typically draw all their staff from the local area. Of our total expense, over 85% goes to staff and businesses within 50 km of us - basically the majority of what we receive in sales goes back into the local area between Mittagong and Goulburn.

Also, when we do any upgrades or major work, it is local tradesmen that are employed. Can the same be said of the larger corporates?

That \$10 you spend in Wingello, Tallong, Penrose, Bundanoon or any of the smaller businesses typically goes back into the local economy very quickly. A thriving local economy lifts the wellbeing of all locals.

Your support of both us and all the other small businesses makes a huge difference.

A New Village BBQ in the Park

Lions Club is building us a BBQ

After the 2020 bushfire ripped through Wingello, the local branch of the Lions Club stepped in and provided many of our villagers with grants of up to \$1,500 to replace destroyed tools, equipment, etc. It was a great benefit to many of us.

They also wanted to provide something for the whole community and have put in quite a bit of funding to build a fantastic BBQ and picnic area in Casburn Park. After a lot of work with the Wingecarribee Shire Council people, the Lions Club have been able to get the plans finalised.

The tables, benches and the BBQ are all wheelchair accessible and are designed and manufactured in Australia. This whole project is fully funded by Lions International and Australian Lions (that is a lot of sausage sizzles) and will be built by local businesses.

The Wingello Hall Committee and Wingello Village Association have also been involved in the consultation and planning process.





Wingello Fire Brigade News

With Covid lockdowns stretching on throughout the month of July and still continuing, Brigade life has been very different. Many people have asked why Wingello and the other Southern Highlands brigades have been restricted when we're not in the Greater Sydney Lockdown LGA's. The reason is that Wingello (and Bundanoon, and Penrose) are all part of the Southern Highlands Zone which spans both the Wingecarribee and Wollondilly Local Government Areas. Because we are an emergency organisation focussed on helping people and keeping them safe, we

follow the guidelines set out from the NSW RFS to keep our members safe and operationally ready when needed.

July has seen the Brigade attend a number of Motor Vehicle Accidents (MVA's), a structure fire where two cars in a carport caught alight, as well as a grass fire where a number of our newer members received even more experience. Most of these calls were attended by our fellow village brigades where, despite the restrictions on training, the professionalism, competence and camaraderie were all displayed in the fulfilment of our roles.

The next fire season is just around the corner, with some of the northern NSW Brigades already having entered their fire danger period. Your brigade is starting to get briefings and predictions on the coming season to help us prepare.

Have you started to think and prepare?

Have you started cleaning the undergrowth from around your properties?

Have you dusted off your fire plans and made sure they are still relevant and workable for your family?

It's never too early to plan and prepare for your safety.
