To the end of November we have had over 1,100mm or rain so tanks are full for which we are grateful. As the Fire Brigade has warned, it only takes 3 to 5 days of hot windy weather to dry out all that tall grass and make us vulnerable to fire. We have seen most of the village take advantage of the lovely days to get some mowing and clean up done. It makes the village look great and makes us all safer too!

## Wingello Fire Brigade News


So by now you would all have heard about the state of the weather in Australia from now until sometime in February 2022. La-Nina is here and here to stay. Full water tanks, cooler temps, plenty of water for our gardens and crops and very little fire danger right?.....

Well, Yes...and...No. All this rain is great for our plants and for the low foliage in our bush as well as the long grass growing on our farms and roadside. How many days of hot weather does it take to "cure" grass into a fire hazard? Months? I Month? Weeks? I Week? It takes as little as 3-5 days of hot windy weather to cure grass and make grass fires a potential bushfire hazard. That's less than a week! Grass fires burn fast, burn hot and move really fast! With this expectation of the fire season, the Wingello brigade has been focussing our recent training on the techniques needed to battle crop and grass fires. Ready to defend and help residents in our area as well as other areas of NSW if required.

One of our members James and his wife Becky welcomed baby Michael into the world and we all con-
