RFS Saturday Training

The Wingello Rural Fire Brigade hosted a joint training operation with Wingello, Penrose, Tallong, Big Hill and Marulan. Realising that many existing and potential community members found it difficult to make week-night training due to work and family commitments, our brigade organised a simulated response to a house and truck fire, co-ordinating with nearby brigades.

Relaying water, following orders, spotting hazards, working with brigades we had rarely worked with and more made for a very successful morning. In the past each district was separate making co-ordination with brigades from other districts difficult. The new integrated system now allows the nearest brigades to respond to incidents nearest to them.

The debrief afterwards brought up the benefits of getting to know fellow members from neighbouring brigades. Working with others in person is much
