

Working to make Wingello more Resilient

What are the critical things to make Wingello safer for all of us?

On Saturday 28 October there was a meeting in the Wingello Hall between Wingello villagers and the Resilient Towns Initiative - a combination of very experienced people from the Wingecarribee Shire Council, Red Cross, Disaster Recovery Australia and more.

The gathering was to allow us to work out priorities to make Wingello safer and from there work out what needs to be done to get there.

A fantastic tool was provided to the village in the form of a very recent (5 Sep 23) aerial photo of Wingello and surrounding areas, printed on material to allow a close up look at where we all are. We *know* we live in the middle of trees - both natural bush and State Forest - but seeing the aerial view at this scale lets you SEE us in the middle of the bush.

We were able to tell the visitors about the fires on 4 January 2020 by pointing to and walking over the areas affected.

From 10:30am to 2:00pm Saturday 4 November, after the Men's Breakfast and before the Craft afternoon, we will be laying out the Marvellous Map in the Hall for all to see. Pop over, take off your shoes and have a giant's view of Wingello.

Our meeting went very well and unsurprisingly there were common concerns by all the villagers attending.

The pretty consistent top three items that we want to address are:

- Crown Land and Council "maintained" land which creates dangerous "fingers of fire" racing straight into the village. Unfortunately this is a very expensive issue where small villages (read: low rates areas) require high cost maintenance. The Crown Lands people have zero funding. So we need to look at our options.
- 2. Village Water Reserve. Suggestion for a large Water tank and bore at Bill O'Reilly Oval. It could be used by RFS trucks to fill up (allowing refilling on both sides of the railway line) as well as the revitalised community garden and locals in time of need. There are issues of funding and technical issues regarding power to the bore to be solved, but the result would be excellent.

What other options do we have to let all villagers know about current threats?

With additional consultations within the village, then accessing the resources on offer, we hope to make an improvement in all these areas.
