

Casburn Park Upgrade starts in January

It should be completed by June

Casburn Park will be closed from 15 January.

Work will commence for the massive upgrade of the park with lots of facilities for all ages and abilities. This should all be completed by June 2024.

The contractors are the same ones who recently completed Bong Bong Common - the area between Moss Vale and Bowral along the main road. It is an excellent example of a great improvement of a public space.


Meanwhile, the Hall will remain open for the majority of the construction period and the parking area will only be closed during the actual parking upgrade process. The number of car parking spaces will remain the same, but it will be sealed and have a footpath providing a much better shared parking and walking area.

The plans are on display in the Wingello Village Store - as seen in this photo with Coby's approval. The "Pump Track" is a small bike track area with lots of curves and slopes to get our younger riders' legs pumping!

By the end we will have BBQ facilities, picnic and other seating, open areas and plenty of natural shade and more trees. Shade cloth over the play ground and so much cool equipment and activities for older and younger children. The much used Basketball/multi-activity court will remain too.

All this work will need some patience from the residents. It is only for five to six months and the end result is a huge win for Wingello villagers and visitors. Having a centralised place to meet and play is a fantastic benefit for all of us. This will be a great opportunity to encourage visitors to our homes with "Let's go to the park. Perhaps an ice cream and chips with a coffee and let the kids run around. I'll get a basketball and we can shoot a few baskets."
