This makes sense as all the other issues derive from that issue - the road is in such poor condition that it is dangerous. A local smashed their car this week as the road was slippery near one of the bends and with no edges the front went down an incline and into a tree. Thankfully the local was not injured, but his vehicle is severely damaged. We're looking forward to Council's response considering this is the main method of access to the Entrance to the Southern Highlands.
