Use it or lose it

The Australian Parliament is currently holding an Inquiry into the Australia Post retail network.

Why does this matter to us?

Australia Post runs a network of over 4,000 retail outlets, of which around two-thirds are Licensed Post Offices (LPOs) — like Wingello, Bundanoon and Marulan. These are owned and run by individuals and families, mostly living in the communities they serve, and paid on the basis of transactions made through the LPO.

In a normal business relationship, the parent organisation wants its licensees to succeed, because their growth means greater success for the whole organisation. In years long past, Australia Post was run by people who had come up through the organisation. They understood what was involved in helping Australians send letters and parcels to friends, family and customers in Australia and around the world.

Today, Australia Post's management is increasingly criticised for lacking that frontline, real-world experience of dealing with customers and delivering mail. LPOs and contractors are treated as cost centres rather than valued partners delivering the essential services the whole business relies on.

As a result, in recent years the focus has shifted to maximising profits by cutting the cost of delivering these key services. Smaller LPOs — particularly in regional and remote areas and smaller towns — are not paid enough for the hours Australia Post demands of them. That's why most LPOs are run alongside other businesses, such as newsagents, chemists, rural suppliers or, like Wingello, cafes and restaurants. Income from Australia Post, combined with the other business, can just about make for a basic living.

Over the last few years there has been a steady decline in the services Australia Post provides, alongside a growing workload and far slower increases in payment.



The current crisis has arisen because many LPOs in rural and regional areas are simply walking away, leaving locals with no postal services at all. When a small LPO closes, there is no replacement mail delivery. It means travelling to the nearest larger centre — anywhere from 30 minutes to several hours away — just to get mail and postal services.

The Wingello LPO is currently in a reasonable position, thanks to a successful cafe and restaurant business alongside a busy parcel and mail service, banking and other services. But “reasonable now” doesn't mean safe long-term — the same pressures facing other regional LPOs are here too.

If you want these services to continue — daily mail, post boxes for 24/7 access, and local banking — you need to support your local LPO. That means sending and receiving your mail and parcels here, and supporting the business we're running alongside.

Once a local LPO is gone, it stays gone.

It is every Tuesday during school term from 10am to 12 Midday at the Wingello Village Hall. Lots of children at every meeting. Great signs for the future of Wingello!

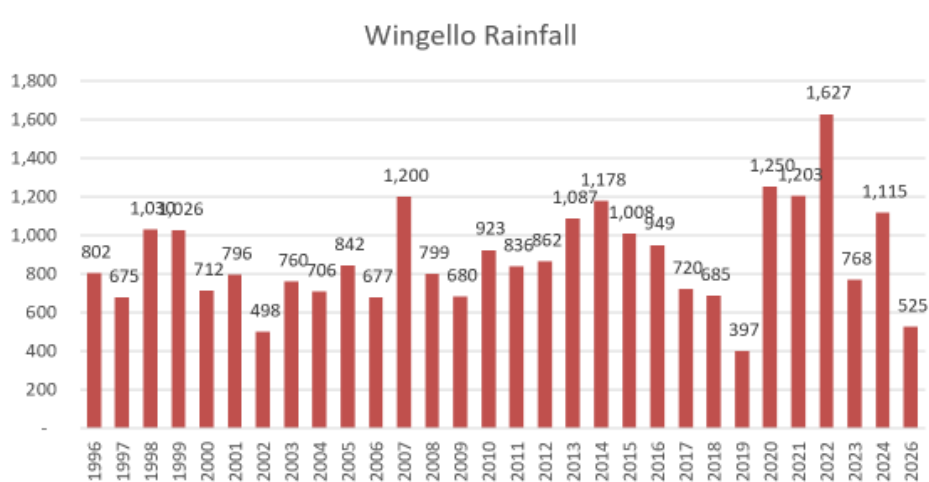
Latest Rain Chart
